Board of Directors Report

Welcome to another great year at Lake Bonnet Village! The 2022-23 season is shaping up to be a wonderful, exciting, and fruitful year.

Here are some of the improvements made over the past year:

- The mortgage on the new clubhouse (Lake Bonnet Hall) was reduced from \$733,000 to \$433,249 since January 1, 2022. Twelve new shares (lots) were sold. The total number of shareholders is now 304.
- The Prospectus has been brought up to date.
- Bocce Ball Courts were built by many volunteers working as a team toward a common goal under the sponsorship of the Fun Club and the Cooperative.
- Canal seawalls were completed because of the leadership of individuals with BOD approval.
- The east fish cleaning station was removed due to the odor and replaced with a beautiful lake viewing area.
- New shelving was installed, and walls were painted at Community Hall (east).
- New Xfinity hookups for internet and phones were installed at both clubhouses.
- New washers and dryers were purchased and installed at both laundry sites.
- A hot-cold water device was installed at the West pool, now matching the East pool.
- New landscaping was installed at Community Hall.
- The yard waste dumpster was relocated to the east end of Grove Road. For our new park residents: only *yard debris* is allowed in this dumpster; no building supplies, shingles, garbage, or other materials.
- Controls were replaced on the sewer lift at the corner of Cedarwood and Gergen.
- Electrical work was done on the docks by volunteers.
- Volunteers constructed cart paths for many residents. Each resident paid the park for materials and use of equipment required to construct their path.
- Tony's Cleaning Service has been contracted to clean the office, both clubhouses, and both laundries this season. Please welcome Tony when you see him working in the park!

Recognition:

- The Board of Directors thanks the Fun Club and all the workers who contributed to providing social events.
- Thank you to residents for another great year of keeping units in good condition and junk removed. Redwood has been the best kept area of the park for the second year.
- Thank you to our summer volunteers for their work at the Community Hall and with garbage pickup.
 These include Joanne Hodges, Jesse and Cindy Hathaway, Bob Gendron, George Forrester, and Becky Richardson.
- A huge THANK YOU to all who worked to help shelter residents during Hurricane Ian. Lake Bonnet Hall was needed, and it came through as a safe refuge.
