What is the Fun Club? We have many new folks in the park who have asked what the Fun Club at Lake Bonnet Village is. The Fun Club was started in the 1980's, long before our park became a Coop in 2000. Its purpose is to promote and administer social activities of the Lake Bonnet Village Co-Operative. All shareholders and renters are members of the Fun Club.

We have four elected Executive Board officers: President (currently Carla Bloss), 1st Vice President (Teresa Riddle), 2nd Vice President (Ilene Radick) and Secretary (Sherry Lawraon) that serve 2-year terms. The fifth

officer, the Treasurer (currently Sandy Gorski) is appointed by the President and approved by the elected officers. In addition, the former President (Maggie Griesemer) and all the Section Leaders are voting members of the Executive Board. They vote to approve social activities and expenses up to \$150 and make recommendations to the General Membership of the Fun Club. The Executive Board meets monthly on the second Monday, November thru March. The General Membership meets monthly on the second Tuesday of the month, with officer elections in March. They approve activities and expenses over \$150 recommended by the Executive Board.

The Fun Club pays for many of the activity support functions in the park. These include the printing of the Chatter newsletter and the Address Directory, providing live music for the February and March Saturday dances, providing kitchen supplies including paper goods and condiments, paying for annual CPR training, providing some of the funds for Christmas & Thanksgiving dinners, State Dinners, Meet & Greet, Ladies Luncheon, the 50th Anniversary Party, and more. Our total expenses this season will be \$8000 - \$9000.

To raise the money for these expenses, we sponsor a variety of fundraisers throughout the season. These include all the breakfasts and dinners like the Chinese Take-Out dinner, Pizza & a Movie, the Italian Dinner, and Chicken Dinner. This year we hope the Chinese Auction on February 4, made possible by donation of items and services of Fun Club members, will be a major source of funding for the season. There are many other contributing events, including rental of tables at Craft Fairs, the Poker Run, many of the 50/50's you participate in at Coffee and Donuts and dances, and more.

All our activities and events in the park, including the fund raisers, are hosted and put on by you, the Fun Club. Every event, from weekly Coffee and Donuts to the annual Meet & Greet, 50th Anniversary Celebration, and Park Auction needs volunteer host(s) and workers to make it happen. This, and all the volunteer work of our Coop Board and members that volunteer to maintain the park, are key reasons why our service fees and rental rates are so reasonable in comparison to other parks. WE NEED YOU! All the Fun Club Activities for the season are posted on the board at Community Hall. Bring a friend or neighbor down and sign up! "Many hands make light work". Board of Directors Report

SPECIAL BOARD REPORT:

A long-time member of our board will be retiring this month. Abe Westbrook has become a living legend in our park. He was elected to the first Co-Op Board of Directors twenty years ago. Abe has served seventeen total years on the board, with many years as the Vice President and the Director of Maintenance. During the summer months he served as Acting President. He was instrumental in the planning and oversight of the building of the new Lake Bonnet Hall/Shelter.

As director of maintenance, Abe has a full slate of responsibilities including managing the pools, shop equipment, sewers, water lines, 2 wells, electric meters, seven buildings, roads, lake and canal spraying, tree trimming and removal, gathering volunteers to pick up garbage, constructing drainage throughout the park, maintaining stone pathways, and overseeing the docks. In addition, Abe is responsible for hiring a maintenance person, securing a company to handle pool maintenance, calling a business for equipment repair and replacement, and hiring a tree man, grass cutters, electrical repair men, and a company to treat the shorelines.

Abe has been the “Rock” through all these past summers that kept the park running smoothly. Every one of us in the park has benefited from Abe’s hard work to meet these responsibilities. And, of course, his service has been free of charge! Abe will be sorely missed on the board, especially for his wit at board meetings.

A reception to honor Abe and his wife, Barb, will follow the January 16, 2023, Board Meeting. Cake and ice cream will be served along with punch and coffee. Everyone at Lake Bonnet Village is invited to join us in thanking Abe for his many years of service.

Co-Op Meeting: The next regular monthly LBV Board of Directors/Shareholders meeting will be held on Monday, January 16, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. in the Lake Bonnet Hall (west). The agenda is posted on the bulletin board at the east end of the mailbox area as well as at both clubhouses. When the regular meeting is adjourned, then the audience is encouraged to ask questions or state concerns you would like the board to consider. Coffee is available.

ELECTION: On Wednesday, January 25, 2023, at 9:00 a.m. in Lake Bonnet Hall (west), the annual election of 3 board members will be held. Also, at the same meeting, the annual vote on (1) WAIVING THE RESERVES and (2) WAIVING THE AUDIT will also be voted on. All shareholders were mailed information about the election and the candidates running to fill the vacancies as well as voting procedures. If you will not be attending the meeting, it is *VERY IMPORTANT* that the PROXY that was mailed to all shareholders indicating your vote on WAIVING THE RESERVES and WAIVING THE AUDIT is returned before January 25. On the proxy provided in that mailing, you can indicate someone other than a name on your share to vote your proxy. The VOTER CERTIFICATE (included in first mailing) can only indicate a person on your share. Also included was a ballot for three board vacancies. We have 3 directors whose terms are over in January: Calvin McAnally, Matt Skjonsby and Merle (Abe) Westbrook. Candidates for these positions are Calvin McAnally, Matt Skjonsby, Jeff Centers and Chuck Hall.

FRIENDLY REMINDERS:

- **Yard waste dumpster** located on East Grove Rd: This dumpster is for LEAVES, BRANCHES, CUT UP LIMBS, GRASSES, PLANTS, ETC. *“IF IT DON’T GROW, IT DON’T GO!!”*. There is a sign prominently posted next to the dumpster explaining what is allowed. NOT ALLOWED: man-made products, building materials, dirt, stones, bricks, metals, paint, etc. The company that picks up our yard waste charges the park \$200 per item that they must remove. In the future, a camera will record activity. If we can identify someone placing something unacceptable in this bin, that person will be held responsible for the fine of \$200 per item.
- **Washing Units:** It is that time of year when all units need to be washed and possibly repainted by January 1st. After that date, we will mail out letters to those who have not met that deadline. We appreciate that almost all residents have already met the deadline. We often hear how clean and well kept our park is, and that is due to the great residents who make that so.
- **Barking Dogs:** We welcome pets in the park. However, UNCONTROLLED barking is a disturbance to neighbors and others. When dogs are left ALONE, they may become stressed and then bark and whine repeatedly. If you are made aware of a problem with your dog, you need and are expected to take steps to change their behavior. The Board has the duty to assure that shareholders and all residents have relative peace and quiet here in their park. Therefore, we will work with a resident to solve the problem but may ask the dog to be removed if the resident does not comply within a stated period.
- **Scheduling:** Any and all activities at either clubhouse must be scheduled by Linda Haven at the office. NO EXCEPTIONS!!

- **Tools:** Power tools (saws, blowers, power washer, etc.) will no longer be loaned out from the co-op garage. All other tools and equipment must be signed out on the sign-out sheet. Do not just walk in and take things out!
- **Volunteers:** We have a sign-up sheet in the workshop if you would like to help out in our park. Right now, we need volunteers to help put in golf cart paths. If you have a special talent that you think we might need and are willing to share, stop in the office and let Donna know and she will see that your message gets to the right people.
- **Very important warning: *The feeding of gators must stop!*** They are becoming bolder because when people feed them from the shoreline, they see every person as a source of food and will come on land to get it from that person or any other who passes by. In the past the park has had to have gators removed (some are killed by authorities if there is no place to take them). Recently, a 5–6-foot gator came from the water to the fish cleaning station while a person was cleaning their catch. When you use the fish cleaning station, place the fish skin in a bag and take it to the dumpster (even if it stinks). DO NOT take them outside to the shoreline and throw them in by hand. The gators will then be looking for people as a source of food (maybe literally)!

OTHER NEWS:

- To assure all our pets have a safe environment here in the park, Board member Melvin Bezinque has been appointed **Pet Vaccination Coordinator** for our park. He is responsible for collecting names of pets and owners to ensure that the annual vaccinations are recorded in the office. Please turn in a copy of your pet's vaccinations to the office at your earliest convenience. A photo of your pet is also requested to identify your pet in case it wanders off. Also, if you are in the park during a hurricane and plan on bringing your pet with you to the shelter in the park, a Bordello shot will be required. We know how special your pet is to you and we thank you for your cooperation.
- Another responsibility assigned to Mel is park **Vehicle Sticker Coordinator**. He will check that vehicle owners have the white window sticker that is to be placed on the driver's side back window. This sticker has a number that is matched in our records indicating that you are a resident. If you do not have this sticker, please come to the office as soon as possible. Campers and visitors are provided with a hanging tag to be placed on their interior rearview mirror while parked. We need to be vigilant about who is in our park. We don't want someone casing out our park in hopes of coming back to steal something or for some other dangerous reason. Reporting any suspicious situation in the park to the office is a good idea.
- **Beautification Burger Nights** was organized in 2012. It has been a very successful fundraiser that enables us to do projects that are not in the budget. Over the past ten years, we have put in curbing, installed white posts, planted flowers, shrubs, and trees, installed the fence at the entrance, placed new benches around the park, purchased picnic tables, purchased Christmas trees and put in the stone covered golf cart paths around the new clubhouse. We have spent \$43,887.77 that was raised to date. This helps beautify the park without raising your maintenance fees. A big thank you for your support.
